### Solving Squabbles

“Hey, I was playing with that.” “It’s mine!” “It’s my turn to watch TV.” “No fair!” Sound familiar? Even the most loving brothers and sisters bicker from time to time.

Whether your children need help getting along with each other or with their friends, you can help reduce the friction with these strategies.

**Make niceness a family policy.** Try creating a kindness rule, like “In our family, we don’t hurt each other with words or actions.” Give your kids examples of polite behavior, such as taking turns and asking permission before using someone else’s things.

**Provide calming alternatives.** When your children become upset with each other, teach them ways to deal with their feelings. *Example:* “I can tell you’re really mad at Ethan. Why don’t you go to another room and take a few deep breaths before saying anything to him.”

**Stay out of it.** Whenever possible, try not to take sides when your youngster bickers. If they can’t solve the situation on their own, consider a family meeting. Talk about each child’s feelings. Then, ask your children to suggest solutions and to choose one that everyone can agree on.

**Applaud tattling—about the good stuff.** Challenge siblings to try to mention good things about each other, such as “Megan helped me rake the leaves,” or “Sean let me use his new baseball glove.”
